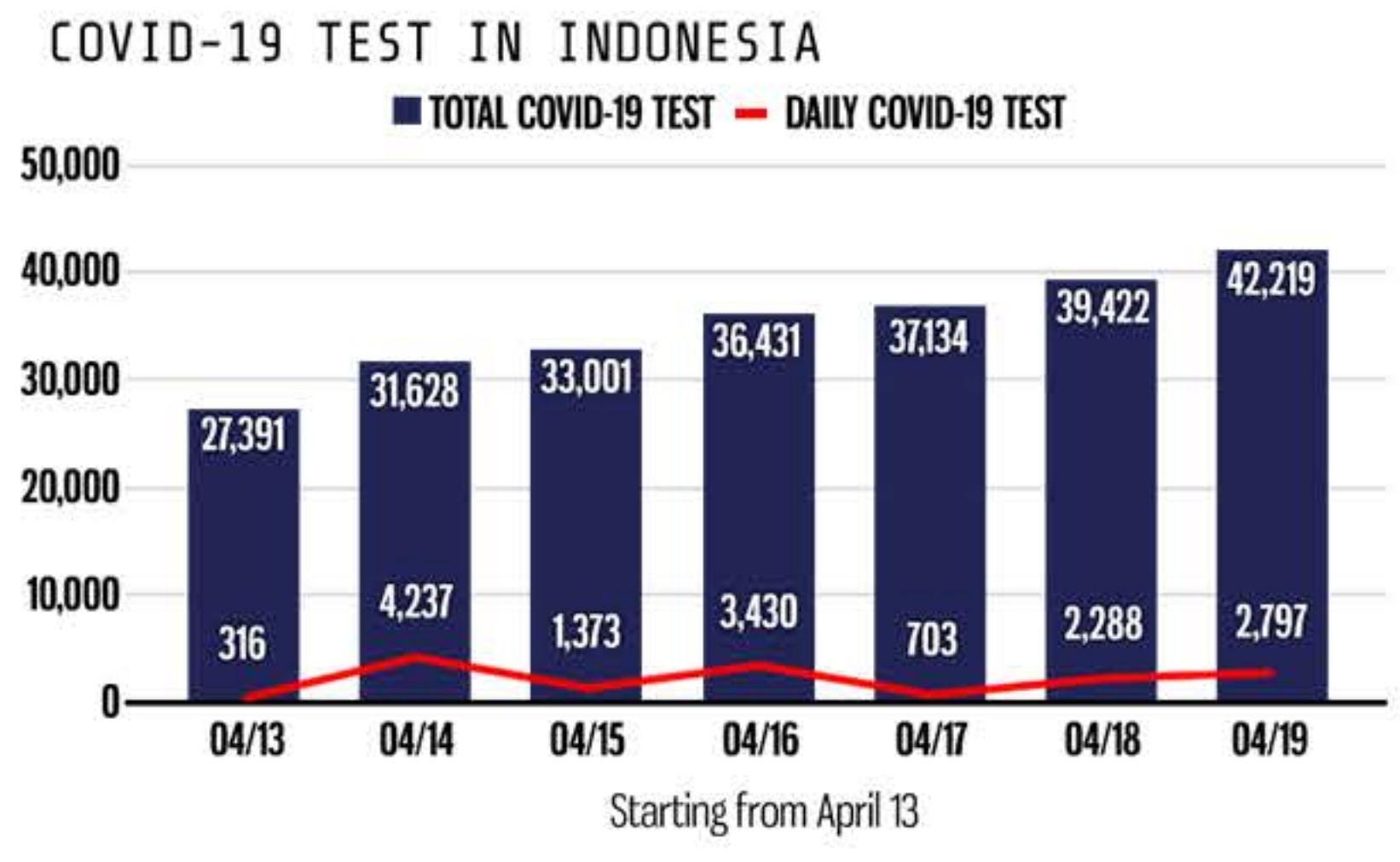


GOVERNMENT MEASURES

- Head of COVID-19 Fast-Response Task Force, Gen (Ret.) Doni Monardo, announced the arrival of 50,000 PCR test kits from South Korea. He also admitted that Indonesia has one of the lowest density of physicians in Asia; hence, calling on all Indonesian nationals to support the national health system by not using self-protection equipment (APD) as the APD should be used exclusively only by medical staff.
- Head of COVID-19 Fast-Response Task Force also reported that the government estimates the peak of COVID-19 outbreak in Indonesia to take place around the end of May, while it believes that the number of cases will start decreasing in July. The government also believes that Indonesia will enter in the recovery phase of the outbreak in September.
- Ad-interim Minister of Transportation, Luhut Binsar Pandjaitan, declined Jabodetabek's proposal on stopping commuter line (KRL) operations during large-scale social restriction (PSBB) period. The minister's spokesperson, Jodi Mahardi, explained that KRL is still needed for workers in the essential sectors, such as the health sector. In addition, Mahardi said that the minister suggested for each region to focus on the effectiveness of PSBB by closing non-essential businesses.
- Noting the high demand for the Pre-Work Card (Kartu Pra-Kerja) program, the Coordinating Ministry of Economic Affairs announced that the second wave of its registration will accommodate 200,000 people. The registration will be opened starting from April 20. Currently, there are 5.4 million applicants, however the government only accepted 164,000 people in the first wave of the program.
- House of Representatives (DPR), Commission X, highly advised the government to reallocate the job training incentives in the Pre-Work Card (Kartu Pra-Kerja) program to social safety net programs which it believes will be more beneficial amid the COVID-19 outbreak.
- Ministry of Finance is finalizing incentives for 11 new industry sectors, including transportation, hospitality, and trade. In the short-term, listed sectors would receive tax relaxations (PPh 21, 22, 25 and PPN). In addition, the ministry is currently preparing a Job Creation and Tax Omnibus Bill, which aims to attract investors and prevent potential unemployment amid the COVID-19 outbreak.

- Ministry of Public Works and Public Housings will support Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) amid COVID-19 outbreak by providing places of business in toll rest areas, National Tourism Strategic Area (KSPN), and border outposts (PLBN). In addition, the ministry will accelerate the construction of 21 public markets.
- Ministry of Health granted faster permits for businesses to sell self-protection equipment (APD) that are qualified based on the national health standards. Meanwhile, APD that are not deemed qualified are allowed to be sold to workers with lower risk of contamination, such as pharmacists, nutritionists, and ambulance drivers.

Indonesia is one of the largest Self-Protection Equipment (APD) producer. However, the country is currently running out of APD has companies whom produce such medical supplies have contractual obligations to fulfil with clients such as South Korea and Japan. Paradoxically, Indonesia is importing raw materials to produce APD from South Korea. The latest agreed to supply Indonesia with these raw materials if Jakarta agrees to deliver in priority South Korea with APDs produced in Indonesia. In order to mitigate the shortage of APD, the administration insist that such equipment should be reserved to medical staff while civil society should use non-medical equipment's such as masks in fabric.

The issuance of Pre-Employment Card continue to sparks debates. The concept – providing job seekers and workers who lost their jobs with incentives – make sense. The incentives takes the form of training sessions and courses to develop skills and obtain certificates on selected platforms. Nevertheless, observers note that the training and course materials – such as training for barista or to be a top-seller for e-commerce website – are no different than available free contents on the internet. Moreover, Indonesian medias argue about the risk of conflict of interest as some of these platforms are owned by members of Presidential Special Staff. In this perspective, the issue related to the Pre-Employment Card is dual: the implementation is limited as only 364,000 people will be selected for the two first waves on a total of 5.4 million applicants, and the content of the incentives might not enable the government to mitigate the rise of unemployment and the economic recovery phase of the outbreak.

Testing capacities continue to raise concern while President Widodo requested that the country should aim for 10,000 tests a day. Carrying test is not so much an issue, as 47,000 tests have been done since the official start of the outbreak. It is however important to understand what are the limits of such testing campaign. First, if the number of tests done gives a good estimate of the government response, it is important to keep in mind that global number of tests does not indicate the number of people actually tested. As a matter of fact, the SOP set up by the Indonesian Ministry of Health shows that people with mild symptoms might be tested between 4 to 5 times. Second, laboratories assigned to handle the outbreak are limited – 35 on April 19 – and the reagents for PCR tests are not widely available in provinces. Providing that reagents are available; the number of daily tests will increase. Last but not least, not all provinces are equal in term of testing. As an example, Yogyakarta Special province can achieve between 400 and 600 tests daily in optimal condition while Bali province is still limited to 68 tests a day.
